Important information about Check-In:

What it is...

Every family needs to complete the Check-In process for students at the beginning of each school year. This involves several required things including, but not limited to:

- Verifying your personal information
- Updating custody information (bring any new court documents)
- Updating health and immunization information (bring any new documentation)
- Completing the Media and Publicity Consent form
- Signing the internet use agreement (freshmen and students new to GJHS only)
- Completing the Military Opt Out form if desired (juniors only)

Families may also apply for:

- Free/Reduced Lunch Program
- Parking permit (eligible juniors and seniors only)
 - o There is no charge for the permit, but you will need to bring:
 - Student's Driver's license
 - Vehicle registration
 - Proof of insurance
 - Your parent

At Check-In your student will get:

- Class schedule
- Locker assignment
- Individualized list of fees*

*Fees are payable with credit card through My Payments Plus, check, or cash.

When and where it is...

Check-In is held in the Student Commons and Cafeteria area of the building with the starting point at the east door into the Student Commons.

If you did not make it to one of the Regular Check-In times...

If you need an alternate time to check in, please come at one of the scheduled times for Make-up Check-In, which will also be held in the Student Commons and Cafeteria area. Make-up Check-In is open to students of all grades.

Dates and Times for Make-up Check-In* are:

Monday, August 8, 4:30 – 7:30 pm (Same day as Back to School Night, which 5:30 pm – 7:30 pm)

Tuesday, August 9, 8:00 – 11:00 am

*Counselors will not be available on either of the Make-up Check-In times.

Back to School Night: Monday, August 8, from 5:30 – 7:30 pm

Back to School Night is the chance to come to school with your student to meet his or her teachers* and see the classrooms and school in general ahead of the first day of classes. (The first day of classes is Wednesday, August 10.) Back to School Night uses an open house format. You are free to come and go during the two hour period according to what is convenient for you.

GJHS Athletics 2016-17

- Each Student Athlete must register Online with Family ID. New students to Grand Junction HS must sign up and create an account. Returning students log in to your account and update information.
- Each Student Athlete must turn into the ATHLETIC OFFICE a current physical (within the last 365 days). Physical forms can be printed off on the Family ID site under Links and/or a form picked up in the GJHS Athletic Office. Physical must be SIGNED and DATED BY THE DOCTOR, clearly stating:
Cleared for all sports without restriction
- Athletic Fee of \$140.00 per sport is DUE prior to first official practice.
- Online payment (starting June 4) through My Payments Plus on the Family ID site under Links.

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STUDENT CLOTHING AT GJHS

Guidelines for Student Clothing at GJHS

At GJHS we strive to offer the best possible setting for learning for all our students. In support of this, we expect students at Grand Junction High School to dress in a manner that is appropriate for school, where the primary focus is to be on learning. This means wearing clothing that, while expressing personality, also is modest and respectful of others. With this in mind, we offer the following condensed dress code rules:

Look for clothing that...

- Covers undergarments. This includes bra straps and boxers.
- Covers traditionally private parts of the body. This includes upper legs and torso (stomach, buttocks, back, chest, and breasts). Short shorts are not school appropriate.
- Is long enough to maintain modesty when viewed from the back, as well as the front. This applies most to skirts and dresses, which need adequate length. Remember that you may need to walk up the stairs, bend over, or sit on the floor at some point during the day. Make sure you can do this and stay covered.
- Stays up, rather than sagging. (Baggy pants and low necklines tend to keep moving down.)

Avoid clothing that...

- Is strapless, asymmetrical (one shouldered), open-backed (halter tops), or spaghetti strapped. These tops might be great layering pieces but should be covered at all times.
- Exposes torso skin, undergarments, or otherwise inappropriate areas of skin (e.g., muscle shirts, see-through tops, low cut tops, short shorts, jeans with "fashion holes").
- Has images or messages that degrade any race, ethnicity, religion, gender, sexual orientation, or disability.
- Has images or messages that are obscene, profane, vulgar, lewd, or legally libelous.
- Has images or messages that promote are suggestive of drugs, alcohol, tobacco, sexual activity, or weapons.
- Has images or messages that denote or suggest membership in a gang. (This includes bandanas of any color other than orange or black, which are only allowed on spirit days.)

(For a complete explanation of our Dress Code, please see Section III - C on pages 32 - 34 of the Student Handbook.)

Please keep these guidelines in mind as you shop for school clothing for your student and also as you monitor how they dress for school each day this year. Parental support of these guidelines is so important and helpful. Thank you for your support in this aspect of your student's participation at Grand Junction High School.

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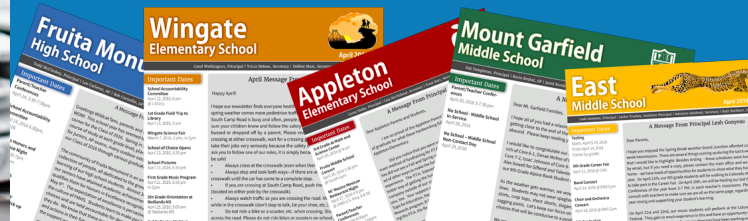
