Before you start applying

Have you given thought to the advantages of starting your education at a two-year community college?

Cost of Tuition > The average community college is 2 thousand dollars less a year than a university.

Flexible Schedule > If you are planning to work while attending school, community college is the best option. They offer far more night classes than universities and more schedule options.

Opportunity to explore major options > Instead of spending thousands of dollars at a private university towards a major that you are less than sure of, consider attending a community school while you are making your decision. Classes cost less, so you will have the opportunity to explore interests that you might not have otherwise pursued.

Smaller Classes > Class sizes can be as small as 15 students.

Colorado Community Colleges offer guaranteed in-state transfer courses > Meaning that credit from these courses must be accepted by every state-funded university in Colorado. (Note: Only certain courses are guaranteed to transfer; check with the college to make sure you are choosing classes that will transfer.)

Colorado Mesa University and WCCC (Grand Junction, CO)

World Changers Scholarship (Full Tuition up to eight semesters)

Three full-tuition scholarships will be annually awarded on a competitive basis to new students who qualify as Trustees Scholars (see parameters below). Competition is by invitation only and occurs on campus early during the spring semester prior to intended enrollment. Students invited to attend and who participate in the two day event will receive an additional Impact Scholarship (amount varies each year). To maintain eligibility, students must maintain a cumulative 3.5 GPA at CCU and meet all student aid eligibility requirements. The scholarship will cover full tuition, which includes the block rate for 12-18 credits, and any amount for additional credits above 18. Recipients are responsible for all fees and other costs associated with attending CCU. Recipients forfeit any eligibility for other CCU based grants and scholarships.

\$14,000 Trustees' Scholarship (\$56,000 maximum up to eight semesters)

Recipients typically have a 3.8 GPA and an ACT score of 28, SAT II composite score of 1860, or New SAT composite score of 1320. To maintain eligibility, students should maintain a cumulative 3.5 GPA at CCU and meet all student aid eligibility requirements.

\$12,000 President's Scholarship (\$48,000 maximum up to eight semesters)

Recipients typically have a 3.6 GPA and an ACT score of 24, SAT II composite score of 1650, or New SAT composite score of 1190. To maintain eligibility, students should maintain a cumulative 3.3 GPA at CCU and meet all student aid eligibility requirements.

\$10,000 Dean's Scholarship (\$40,000 maximum up to eight semesters)

Recipients typically have a 3.4 GPA and an ACT score of 22, SAT II composite score of 1530, or New SAT composite score of 1110. To maintain eligibility, students should maintain a cumulative 3.2 GPA at CCU and meet all student aid eligibility requirements.

\$7,000 Honors Scholarship (\$28,000 maximum up to eight semesters)

Recipients typically have a 3.0 GPA and an ACT score of 21, SAT II composite score of 1450, or New SAT composite score of 1030. To maintain eligibility, students should maintain a cumulative 3.0 GPA at CCU and meet all student aid eligibility requirements.
